Serendipity

Yranne Rivera Osorio, an experienced, professional nurse from Venezuela, and Kim Schroeder, a retired nurse and previous Director of Adult Education, were brought together by forces unknown to them. Some would call it—serendipity.

Last July, LVSSC reached out to our tutors inquiring if any were available to take an additional student. Kim answered the call and was delighted to receive Yranne's contact information. During their first meeting, Yranne shared her goal to obtain her Registered Nurse license in the U.S.

Kim knows that the Florida Board of Nursing has strict educational, English, and testing requirements for foreign-educated nurses. Although Yranne has 5 years of University training in nursing and extensive clinical experience, the journey will be long and challenging.

As part of Kim's educational plan, Yranne attends regular group tutoring at the North Port library as well as working with a Start Now! tutor. Yranne is spending several hours each week studying basic English terms and learning about American culture. Kim's plan is to build upon and reinforce the ESL curriculum while adding medical terminology. And so the journey began!

Yranne learned medical terminology and abbreviations quickly. Kim challenged her with clinical questions and soon realized that Venezuela uses different medical equipment.

Another level of learning was required showing pictures of common medical equipment and explaining their use.



Kim also used Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) resources to prepare Yranne to take the CNA exam.

In spring of 2019, Yranne surprised Kim with a Certificate of Completion from a CNA training program. The next hurdle was the actual exam. Yranne passed her CNA written and clinical exams on her first attempt! Congratulations!

In addition to learning English and American nursing practices, Yranne had other challenges. She worked diligently for nearly a year to obtain her Venezuelan educational records which Kim knew were required for the Board of Nursing's evaluation process. The records finally arrived, and Kim submitted them for formal translation and evaluation. She introduced Yranne to the West Coast Chapter of the National Association of Hispanic Nurses based in Tampa. Yranne joined the organization and can now benefit from nurses who have had similar journeys.

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

Rosemarie Sulzbach, long-time ESL class instructor, is pleased that one of her students, Oksana, had such good results from their lesson on "How to Write a Complaint Letter."

Oksana wrote to her insurance company using the letter format she learned in class. She explained that her family and many of their Russian-speaking friends have that insurance. She wrote, "For some reason, we were transferred to another doctor who does not speak Russian." Their doctor spoke Russian, and some of them aren't able to communicate effectively in English yet. Oksana asked, "Is it possible to return our doctor to us, or do you have other doctors who speak Russian?"

Oksana received a call from the insurance company saying their doctor would be returned to them. Rosemarie thinks that other adult language learners will be encouraged by Oksana's confidence.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH - TELLING OTHERS WHAT WE DO

Several times each year, volunteers are needed to represent Literacy Volunteers at community events and talk with potential tutors, students, and donors about our organization. Another North Port outreach event is the Community Wellness Fair at New Hope Community Church. Ruth said, "We had an interesting time, met a lot of new people, and handed out some brochures."

In Venice, volunteers will be needed for our booth at the Venice Book Fair on March 21 in Blalock Park and at the Rotary Club's Annual Fine Arts and Crafts Festival on January 18-19 at the Venice Airport Festival Grounds.

A new outreach and fundraising event will take place at "Jumping Under the Stars" at Fox Lea Farm on Auburn Road in Venice on Feb. 7. Literacy Volunteers will be taking tickets, shuttling attendees in golf carts, and selling beer and 50/50 tickets. Fox Lea Farm hosts various types of horse shows throughout the year that attract visitors from all over North America to Venice.

Empowering Students with Guided Self-Study

LVSSC was fortunate to have the creative efforts of tutor Walt Koenig design a course called **'English Quick Start'** for our Computer Lab in the North Port Family Service Center. The program was piloted this spring (2019) with five students participating and was focused on lower level learners. The techniques demonstrated could be used with any level students. The class met once a week. Each class was 'stand-alone,' so missing a lesson was not an issue.

The key to the program was student empowerment. Within 3 months, students would ideally move from the lower to the Intermediate level if they practiced the techniques taught in class for one hour a day. It was better if a student had a tutor, but by empowering the student, the program worked well even if a tutor had not yet been assigned.

The 'English Quick Start Guide' we developed contained the following:

Encourage students to read as much as possible:

We assigned an interesting text, some of which the students could choose to listen to online. We found that text from Newsela.com and Voice of America (learningenglish.voanews.com) are quite effective. The optimum learning sequence is to:

- listen to the recording 3 times and learn what you can
- read along while listening
- read it out loud yourself
- record yourself reading it and compare

We also used *Side by Side* and other texts to reinforce the day's learning objectives. We sent the links out to the students via email the week before the class so the students could do the reading and look up any vocabulary they needed or they could do the lesson if they could not come to class.

Sizeable Vocabulary:

We know that with the right words a person needs only 625 words to express themselves in any language; 1,000 words gives a person 80% proficiency. So emphasis was put on key vocabulary. Students used an online translation application (we used Google Translate) with their native language. This can even be used in the grocery store! We introduced students to a flash card memorization app (we used ANKI) or a method such as 'Goldlist.'

Use a Self-Study Program:

Our computer lab has self-study courses like Rosetta Stone and Rocket English. The students were encouraged to sign up and use the programs consistently. If the students were lucky enough to have been matched with a tutor, the tutor's job was then to provide **comprehensive input just above the student's level**, **not total immersion** which is too overwhelming. Also, the tutor was a resource to clarify any areas of confusion.

We didn't obsess about grammar. That will come naturally as students get more exposure by reading and listening. We encouraged the class to make these activities part of the student's lifestyle and incorporate them into everyday activities.

Perhaps the best outcome is that students learned and comprehended English as it is actually used! They were empowered to continue to use these techniques with or without our help.

We plan to do more of this in the future.
