Eliza says that teenagers are all the same, with the same problems. She has over 200,000 YouTube subscribers. She is also enjoys riding horses and volunteers as an assistant for an Equine Therapeutic Riding service for autistic children.

Eliza's attraction to the Sarasota area is because it is like Europe in that there is a great



deal of outdoor activity. In Poland people engage for all sorts of outdoor events, something Eliza enjoys here as well.


Here's how it started. First they met a young woman of Vietnamese background who was working in a local nail salon. With their help, the student learned English in our ESL program.


