Juliette, a Haitian university graduate with a degree in administration, arrived from Haiti five years ago fluent in French and Creole and with an eagerness to learn English. Deb Metzler, a retired educator, became her tutor within a couple weeks of her arrival and they continue to meet regularly.

Initially, they met at the library in North Port. Juliette lived close by and was able to walk to the library.

More recently, they often have their sessions at Senator Bob Johnson's Landing, a county park along the banks of the Myakka River in North Port. Juliette got her driving license a couple of years ago and now is able to drive to her lessons. During the worst of the pandemic and when Deb who is a "snowbird" is in Maine, they meet via FaceTime.

Deb had French classes in elementary school many decades ago but says she remembers little more than "Bonjour". However, Juliette's English classes in school provided her with the English sounds for the alphabet and that gave this tutor and student a foundation for their initial lessons.

In the first couple of years while working with Deb, Juliette demonstrated her dedication to learning English through her weekly one-on-one lessons and her attendance in English classes offered through Literacy Volunteers at the North Port Library as well as classes at Suncoast Technical College.

In Haiti Juliette used her degree in administration and was employed as an office assistant in a law practice. In recent years since living in the US, she has worked in an assisted living facility and currently is employed in a supermarket. Juliette aspires to become a registered nurse.

She is motivated to master English to the level where she will be successful attending college and reaching her current professional goal. With her ongoing commitment to learning there is no limit to what she might achieve.

Juliette is filled with gratitude for all the Literacy Volunteers who she has worked with since arriving in this country.

In addition to their English lessons this pair has shared many personal stories and life's challenges over the past five years. They clearly have a special bond of respect and friendship.

Judith McGinty joined Literacy Volunteers in August 2014, and her first student was "Just Harry" Avalyon from Armenia, who entertained us at the 2015 Annual Meeting with a humorous presentation on how much he loved American idioms. Harry produced an updated video version for the 40th Anniversary Celebration that had us all laughing.

Judith joined the Board of Directors in April 2015 and volunteered to be our Newsletter Editor in 2016, producing her first newsletter in May.

Judith recently resigned from the Board and her Newsletter Editor position. She will be missed, and we want to recognize the contributions she has made to the Board and to this organization. In addition to volunteering, Judith has been a generous financial donor to both Literacy Volunteers and to The Foundation of Literacy Volunteers of South Sarasota County.

Judith served as Literacy Volunteers' Vice President in 2020-2021 and as President in 2021-2022. So Many Students Had No Idea About Hurricanes

When Ukraine was invaded, Hanna was living there with her two young children about 800 miles from the Polish border and not far from Russia.

She quickly determined that they needed to leave the country and get to a safer place, far from the invaders. She drove to Poland although it took several weeks. They slept in train stations at night for safety. They saw bodies everywhere along the way. She was able to contact her husband who was working on a construction contract in Germany. They reunited and soon discovered that a distant Russian relative in North Port could help them immigrate to the U.S. through a government program known as Uniting for Ukraine. Those who come under the program must have a place to live. He provided that. The web site for Uniting for Ukraine is https://ukraine.welcome.us/

While this was unfolding, Dan, a Venice resident, was looking for ways he could help the Ukrainians. He read an article about Literacy Volunteers and the need for ESL tutors. He quickly enrolled in a tutor class and soon was matched with Hanna, a recent arrival from Ukraine. He learned that her living arrangements were less than ideal. When he realized she and her family were living in a mobile home, he became concerned. A serious hurricane was forming in the Atlantic and could hit her new neighborhood.

We share this story with you because we wondered how the newest arrivals were preparing for Hurricane Ian. Dan found out that his student had no idea how dangerous the situation could be. He decided to bring this new immigrant family into his own home in Venice. And because he is a real estate agent, he was able to help get them an apartment. They also bought an old car that Hanna's husband is able to maintain.

Dan is working with Hanna to get a green card and to fast track her English language skills because Hanna, a masters prepared chemical engineer, wants to continue her career but needs better English ability.

This Literacy Volunteers tutor went beyond the role of a tutor, may have saved lives, and certainly enhanced the lives of these new residents.

I also had to get a good TOEFL score to apply to universities to study for 2 more years to get my dental license and have a career in the USA. The truth is I have achieved everything. I am a hygienist in Florida, I have a job, and I can communicate great with my patients. I was also able to obtain a good score on the TOEFL and apply to universities. I was accepted to the University of Puerto Rico, where I will be receiving my classes in English and Spanish and I will start there next year. I hope to continue in this program and continue learning from these wonderful people.
