

President's Comments

As we head into summer we are closing in on a significant year for LVSSC. We have opened our StartNow! program in our North Port facility, our new English Computer Learning Lab is progressing, thanks to a very generous grant from the Plantation Community Foundation, the new LVSSC website is ready to go live, and we are beginning to solicit sponsors and sell tickets for our first annual literary event, An Evening with Randy White, at the Venice Yacht Club on February 28th, 2019. While we are experiencing exciting opportunities, we continue to work at meeting the daily challenges of matching students with tutors, especially those students who prefer to meet on evenings and weekends due to employment or family commitments.

Over the past few months, a few of our board members have participated in a series of workshops on Earned Income sponsored by The Patterson Foundation. The focus of the workshops is to help non-profit organizations such as LVSSC consider ways to increase their financial stability by providing services or products for a fee. In our case, we are exploring the possibility of expanding our Literacy services to include a Workplace Literacy Program that would provide English classes onsite for local employers. The employers would be expected to compensate LVSSC for these courses, and we in turn would compensate the tutors. The fourth and final workshop is in late June. If we decide to proceed, The Patterson Foundation will provide support for this new program.

Plantation Grant

For many years, the Plantation Community Foundation has supported us with annual grants of \$1,000 to \$2,000. Following the 2017 grant cycle, we decided to compete for their annual Impact Grant which is given to one organization annually for approximately \$20,000. Of course, we had never imagined having a computerized English Learning Lab because of our limited financial resources. This would be possible if we were awarded the grant! Claudia Daniels wrote a very effective grant proposal, and Nancy Pike prepared a detailed list of potential components for the \$20,000.

Our New English Learning Lab



After having been so fortunate as to receive the computer lab grant, we were faced with the challenge of how to design and implement a computer learning lab that would meet our needs and demonstrate to the Plantation Community Foundation that we used their funds in a cost effective way. We have several tutors who have voiced interest in this technology. Fortunately, two of them, Walt Koenigh and David Williams, both have extensive experience with computers and educational software. We formed a committee comprised of Walt, David, Kim Pike, board members Debi Hoefer, Nancy Pike, Joe Pokorney, and our intern Nicky Gayle. This committee met weekly over a period of six weeks and has developed a detailed list of computers, software, desks and associated components to establish a modern English Learning Lab. Our overall concept is to design a lab with flexibility to allow us to meet our needs in the future. We now have several more tutors who have expressed an interest in exploring how they can use the lab to help teach English to their students.

Annual Card Party Deemed a Success

Our annual fundraiser card party was hosted for the seventh year by the Jacaranda Trace Retirement Community on March 28. One hundred and five attendees enjoyed fruit, pastries, and beverages provided by Jacaranda Trace while playing Bridge, Hand and Foot, Ulcers, Dominoes, and Mahjong.

Start Now! Update

The North Port student waiting list had decreased from 66 students (April 2017) to approximately 24 students after the recent April Tutor Training Workshop, but our numbers have ticked up again in the past couple of weeks due to the northern migration of so many of our tutors (Start Now! tutors included). We're looking for some tutors to help out during the summer, if anyone is interested in meeting some fantastically interesting adult learners and picking up an hour or two of tutoring here and there. The Start Now! tutor doesn't have to create the lesson plan or materials (we provide them). They simply meet with the student to present the lesson and afterwards record their progress. Since June 2017, 31 students have come in for a SN! interview. Some have been matched with a permanent tutor right away, but 26 students met with Start Now! tutors for at least one lesson or more. Several Start Now! tutors have enjoyed working with a particular student so much that they have requested to be permanently matched!

Intern Update

Nicky Gayle, from Queen's University in Ontario, Canada, was placed with LVSSC for three weeks from March 19 - April 6 for her Alternative Practicum Experience. Nicky assisted with several projects. Quality Assurance

As all of you know, our organization covers a large area of Sarasota County. We have tutors and students in Venice, Nokomis, Osprey, Laurel, Northport and Englewood. But we are one group and need to maintain our quality and continuity. To this purpose LVSSC now offers a minimum of five Continuing Education sessions for tutors; and tutors are asked to participate in at least three of these per year. The schedule of Continuing Education sessions will be available in early September. Most sessions will present a topic appropriate for tutors teaching our ESL students. If you are tutoring a student in Basic Reading, Comprehension and Writing, you will find at least one session that addresses those topics.

Sessions will be in the format of a luncheon or coffee, with a featured speaker, or structured classes at State College of Florida and the Start Now! office. Attendance at the Annual Meeting or a Board meeting are also considered qualifying sessions. If you participate in a session outside those we offer, please let us know so that you receive the credit.

Below is a very preliminary list of suggested topics. We need your input. Please let us know what topic you would like to have included. If you are tackling a tough teaching situation, let us know. Result of Direct Appeal

Early in 2017 the board listened to a presentation from a fundraising consulting firm called One to One Group. They were highly recommended and have a good track record. After months of discussion and an encouraging reference from United Way who had engaged them, we decided to proceed with a fundraising contract. One to One Group would prepare a professionally designed mailing piece, acquire a local mailing list, and send out two mailings, one this past March and a follow-up in November. The results of the March effort were less than we anticipated, about \$3,300. However, we expect a much larger amount of donations when the November follow-up mailing is sent.

The Giving Challenge

May 2nd was the date for this year's Giving Challenge, the annual online fundraising event sponsored by the Community Foundation of Sarasota County and the Patterson Foundation. We had a very successful event raising about \$7,400 including our estimated matching from the Patterson Foundation. This is the second largest amount we have raised in our five years of participation, but less than last year, due to very generous matching rules applied last year.
