This is the story of an energetic family of parents and four bright children who were living in a small town near Siberia and looking for a better future. One of the siblings, Egor Gnusov, now 20, works with his ESL tutor in a study room in the North Port Library. He, the eldest of the children, tells the tale of their journey to opportunity in the United States.

According to this intelligent, shy young man, in Russia, his home country, there were very few ways to improve one's circumstances without moving to a major city. Then, a few years ago, Egor's grandmother, who had migrated to

Washington State, urged the family to come to the U.S. Without much hesitation, the entire family relocated, not to Washington, but to North Port because, as Egor says, it doesn't rain so much.

About a year after arriving here, Egor was paired with Jack Nugent, an LVSSC volunteer tutor. At the time, Egor was enrolled in North Port High School and hesitantly spoke some English. He was Jack's first assignment as a newly trained tutor. Jack didn't have a teaching background like some of the other new tutors, but Jack is a natural teacher and very effective with young people. He attributes that to his many years as a small business owner, employing and managing teenagers.



For the past year, Jack and Egor have met once a week at the library for English lessons. Both seem very pleased with their progress. Jack enjoys teaching, and Egor is learning and speaking English more confidently.

Egor may be hesitant about his ability to speak English, but he can be proud of so much. He recently graduated from North Port High School and has good SAT scores that will get him admitted to college. Egor's English was sufficient to pass the Florida Drivers test without the help of a translator. In addition to these major milestones, with Jack's help, he has a job at Jacaranda Trace as a food server. His new goal is to be able to speak English without an accent. That's a tall order, Jack!!

Passing the Baton



President's Comments

As we begin 2018, LVSSC is looking at significant opportunities while facing a number of new challenges. All of this is a result of our continued growth over the past few years and our successes in 2017. This past year we increased our tutors and the number of students served, we added a major new project Start Now! North Port, expanded our board, and increased our visibility. All of this growth is supported by limited financial resources, three dedicated part-time employees, and a hard-working board.

Lavonne Radovich's Prototype Tutor Training Workshop

Lavonne Radovich has been an educator for nearly 20 years. She has an M.S. with concentration in Curriculum and Instruction. Her list of educational experiences and accomplishments is too long to include here. Even before seeing her resume, I was hooked. She had me at Hello because of her welcoming demeanor, something that our tutors-in-training need to be able to convey to their students. They will be greeting people who are often new to our country and don't speak English.

Imagine being a newcomer who is trying to navigate in our society, but doesn't understand the culture or English. It's very confusing. Americans may just be the most generous people in the world. The generosity of time and talent surprises many newcomers. If one has been accustomed to living under an authoritarian regime, generosity is probably not well known. At the risk of being political...let's say it out loud.

Most people don't migrate from wealthy countries with stable governments. Besides the cultural nuances, Americans speak in idioms which are so difficult to grasp.

Lavonne's approach to tutor training is a bit different from the presentation LVSSC has used successfully for many years. She brings guest speakers for specific areas such as Learning Styles, Pronunciation, Using Technology to Teach English, etc. She strongly believes that today's tutors-in-training will come away with a good understanding by actively participating in the workshop.

Lavonne teaches us to let the student lead. She encourages us to use pictures as much as possible. For new vocabulary she advises: "See it, Say it, Do it, Touch it, Trace it, Write it, and Repeat". Make it real to all the senses. She uses this approach with both tutors-intraining and her ESL students.

Lavonne, like Esther Bird, LVSSC's established Tutor Trainer, has completed the rigorous path to becoming a ProLiteracy Certified trainer.



Now, Denise Gastineau, their colleague who is also a very qualified teacher, is on the path to the same certification.

LVSSC tutor trainers conduct several classes each year for volunteers who want to teach English to adults who either don't speak English, or want to improve their English comprehension. Some of our other students are native English speakers but need help with basic reading and writing.

Many of our tutors are retired teachers. Others have not taught previously but soon realize they can teach, and they do a great job. They come away from either of our Tutor Training classes with the knowledge they need and with the resources provided by LVSSC. They also have the opportunity to attend additional workshops and meetings conducted for the tutors, so they can hone their skills and keep in touch with the teaching staff. We are very happy to have Lavonne as one of our Tutor Trainers.
